

Cold Weather and Winter Fuel Payments

Payments and grants are also available to help those age over 60 or those on a low income stay warm this Winter.



Cold Weather Payment

Cold weather payments can help people who receive certain benefits with additional heating costs during the winter period.

The 2022/23 scheme runs from 1 November 2022 to 31 March 2023. A payment of £25 will be paid for each seven-day period when your local temperature is either recorded as, or forecast to be, an average of zero degrees Celsius or below, between 1 November 2022 and 31 March 2023. You don't need to apply.

If you are eligible to receive a cold weather payment, you'll be paid it automatically into the same bank or building society account as your benefit payments.

Winter Fuel Payments

If you were born on or before 26 September 1956 you could get between £100 and £300 tax-free to help pay your heating bills.

You will get your Winter Fuel Payment automatically (you do not need to claim) if you're eligible and either:

- get the State Pension
- get another social security benefit (not Housing Benefit, Council Tax Reduction, Child Benefit or Universal Credit)

If you do not get either of these or if you live abroad, you may need to make a claim on the government website.

If you've got a Winter Fuel Payment before, you do not need to claim again unless you've deferred your State Pension or moved abroad.

The deadline for you to make a claim for winter 2022 to 2023 is 31 March 2023.

Warm Home Discount Scheme

Warm Home Discount is a one-off payment to reduce eligible customers' bills over the winter months. This winter (2022-23), it's rising from £140 to £150.

You get the payment automatically if your electricity supplier is part of the Warm Home Discount scheme and you or your partner receive the Guarantee Credit portion of Pension Credit. One of you must be named on your bill.

The money is not paid to you - it's a one-off discount on your electricity bill, usually between October and March.

You may be able to get the discount on your gas bill instead if your supplier provides you with both gas and electricity. Contact your supplier to find out. You may qualify for the discount if all of the following apply:

- you are in receipt of the Guarantee Credit element of Pension
 Credit known as the 'core group'
- You're on a low income and meet your energy supplier's criteria for the scheme known as the 'broader group'
